spring March, April, May

summer June, July, August

autumn September, October, November

winter December, January, February

climate what the weather is like most of the time in one place.

weather the day to day conditions of a place

weather forecast prediction of what the weather will be like in the near future

temperature a degree of how hot or cold something is. It is measured using a thermometer.

hot, warm, cold, cool, freezing, frosty, wet, dry, sunny, cloudy, showery, stormy, windy, breeze, gale, rainy, sunny, snow, shower, drizzle, gale, thunder, lightning, sleet, fog, mist...
