### Key Vocabulary:

**website** a page which someone has made which you can look at using the internet.

**search engine** a tool which helps you search the internet.

**key words** the words we type into a search engine. window that opens without the user selecting this.

**password** a string of characters used for authentication

### How do we know if websites are reliable?

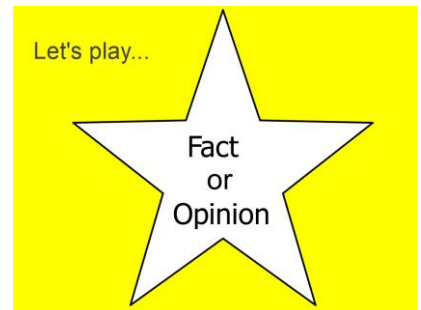
Anyone can make a website and some information online is opinion not fact.

Some websites are trying to sell us things.

Internet searching is improved by using the correct key words.

When we search for information safely online, we use a children's search engine (Swiggle, Kiddle, Cogglekids, KidRex).

If we see something upsetting we minimise the page and tell an adult we trust.



### Securing our information – passwords

Passwords can help protect accounts, computer files and personal information.

We do not share our passwords with anyone else.

More complex password are difficult for others to guess.
