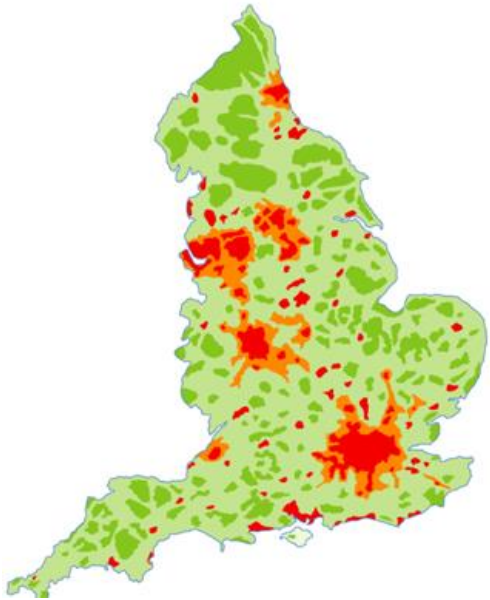




Where were children evacuated to?

Key Facts

The principle countries involved in the Allied Powers were the UK, USA and France.

The principle countries involved in the Axis Powers were Germany, Japan and Italy.

Children were evacuated from large cities to rural locations as these places were less likely to be bombed.

Many places in the local area were bombed during the war. It was targeted for its railway that connected Barnes to central London.

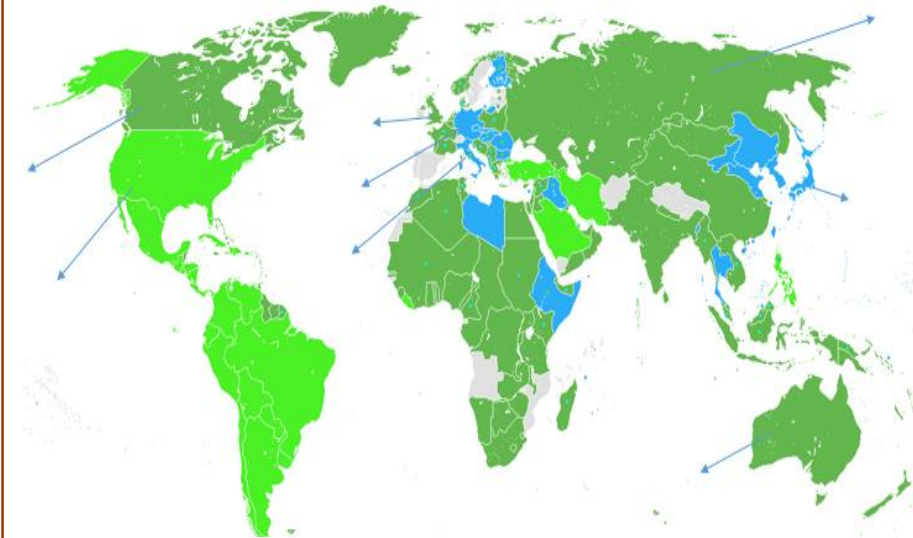

Key Vocabulary

- allied powers** the countries that fought against the axis powers. This included the UK, USA and France.
- axis powers** the countries that fought against the allied powers. This included Germany, Italy and Japan.
- equator** the imaginary line that divides the world in two halves.
- northern hemisphere** countries which are north of the equator.
- southern hemisphere** countries which are south of the equator.
- urban areas** towns and cities.
- rural areas** the countryside.
