



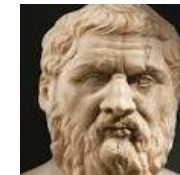

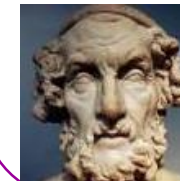

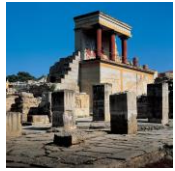

Key Facts

The first Olympic Games was created by the ancient Greeks and held in 776 BCE.
The Greeks worshipped many gods and goddesses. Zeus was seen as the king of the gods.
Historians learnt lots from Greek pottery as they often depicted scenes of Greek life.
