Allah Muslims believe Allah is the one true god

Mohammed (pbuh) is believed to be the last prophet sent by God (Allah) to teach them how to live according to His law.

Five Pillars of Islam are what Muslims should do to lead a good life. They are **Shahadah** (declaration of faith), **Salat** (praying five times a day), **Sawm** (fasting during Ramadan), **Zakah** (giving money to charity) and **Hajj** (a pilgrimage to Makkah).
