

Pupil code of conduct for remote learning

- Follow the activities suggested by your class teacher via Teams. We will provide a weekly set of tasks and we recommend you follow a routine that works for you and your family. We endeavour to make the work as independent as possible (especially for the older children) as we fully appreciate parents will be working from home.
- 2. If you are unsure of any activity, message your teacher through Teams to clarify, so that you can complete it.
- 3. When online, you should address your teachers and peers with the normal manners and kindness we would expect in school.
- 4. Please make sure all contact with your teachers is via your school email address.
- 5. Think carefully about where you will be able to work effectively without distractions. A desk or dining table is best.
- 6. You are not required to wear school uniform but we advise you dress in such a way that will produce a productive learning mindset.
- 7. If you are creating a video, please take care with appropriate clothing and behaviour.
- 8. Nothing posted online by your teachers should be uploaded to social media. Posting anything to social media without the consent of those in the image/footage/recording, is a breach of the acceptable use policy.
- 9. Remote or virtual learning will be a new experience for us all. Please be understanding as your teachers adapt their teaching to this new platform and be supportive of them and your peers. If something goes wrong or doesn't work, please wait patiently (drop everything and read instead?) or go onto another task.
- 10. Remember to take breaks and lunch at the usual time and be mindful of how much screen time you are accruing. Keep up those movement breaks for both your physical and mental wellbeing.
