## In Y3, you start off writing entries in your KS1 Reading Journal until spring term. These are the starting expectations.

You will be expected to have a book 'on the go' at all times. As well as at home, there are opportunities to read at school during some registration times and during guided reading.

## What to do:

- Read every day for at least 10 minutes
- Complete at least four entries each week
- Try to **read out loud with an adult at home** as much as you can. They will be able to help you understand words you don't know and will be able to check you have understood what you have read.

Your teacher will look at your journal during class reading and guided reading lessons. You will also need to hand in your reading journal on the set day.

## From spring term, the following expectations apply to your KS2 reading journal:

You will be expected to have a book 'on the go' at all times. As well as at home, there are opportunities to read at school during some registration times and during guided reading.

## What to do:

- Read every day for at least 10 minutes
- Four times a week complete a standard log. Write the date, title of the book, and page number
- When you read with an adult, write 'A' in the margin under the date
- In addition, one extended entry needs to be completed. Each week you will be given tasks to choose from.
- Hand in your reading journal on the set day. Your teacher will give you feedback.

Try to **read with an adult at home** as much as you can. They will be able to help you understand words you don't know and will be able to check you have understood what you have read.
