- choose three words that interest you, write them out, identify their word class, define them and include a synonym and antonym (if it has one – remember, concrete nouns do not have antonyms).
- either do a summary of your reading (aiming for accurate and ambitious prose) or complete one of the reading challenges contained in the front of your reading journal.
- please aim to read a wide range of literature including non-fiction, newspapers and poetry.

Vocabulary task example – 3 words set out in the following way:

Esoteric (adjective): likely to be understood by only a small number of people with a specialised knowledge.

Synonyms: obscure, arcane, cryptic

Antonyms: simple, familiar
