


All children in from **08.45 – 12.30**, unless they are staying until 3.15pm for their Reception Baseline Assessment and initial

Please note...



Name writing

If you are practising with your child to write their name please ensure they are forming their letters correctly and especially that they **do not** do it all in capitals. It is better to do it with big movements, such as with large chalks on the ground, rather than create an awkward pencil grip.

Knowing their sounds

We **do not** expect children to know their sounds. We will teach them once they are settled! If you are segmenting and blending for them, ensure you are modelling it correctly, without additional vowel sounds. Unlearning incorrectly pronounced sounds is very hard.

Skills that will set them up for a smooth transition into Reception are:

- ✓ Being able to greet new people and say please and thank you in normal interactions
- ✓ Asking for help from an adult
- ✓ Waiting for their turn
- ✓ Following instructions (like put your coat on a peg and sit on the orange spot)
- ✓ Looking and listening to someone who is speaking and responding to questions
- ✓ Dressing and undressing independently (including buttons and zips)
- ✓ Using scissors effectively
- ✓ Managing their toileting needs independently
- ✓ Being willing to have a go at new experiences
- ✓ Persisting when challenges occur
- √ Saying how they feel
- ✓ Using kind hands and kind words with others
