

Welcome to Year 2 Transition booklet

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope that you all have an enjoyable summer break and we look forward to seeing you on **Wednesday 6th September**, ready for Year 2.

We would like to make the transition from Year 1 to Year 2 as smooth as possible so have provided a booklet with key information. We hope that you find this useful.

Morning Routine

The **school gates and classroom doors will open at 8:45am**. We start learning straight away so please ensure your child is on time. If they arrive at 9.00am they miss 1 hour and 15 minutes of learning a week.

- **2S** should come through the main school gates and turn left down the Year 2 passage (this will be clearly sign posted on the first day back). Please can parents and children line up in an orderly fashion on the right hand side next to the windows. Once your child has gone into class, please exit via the gate at the end of the passage to avoid congestion.
- **2C** should walk through the main school gates and enter the school. Go through the hallway into the playground. They will be entering via the cloakroom, with the Year 1 children.
- If you have any messages that need to be communicated, please pop your class teacher an email. The teachers will not be available to speak to at this time as they will be teaching.
- If you arrive after 9am you must go to the front desk where the office staff can then mark you in. Please do not knock on the classroom door as this then interrupts learning time. Thank you so much for your help with this.

Moving into Year 2, we encourage the children to adopt greater independence. Therefore, we suggest that your children carry their own bags and belongings to school ensuring a smooth and quick goodbye at the door. We really appreciate your cooperation with this procedure. It will help to keep drop off a smooth and calm experience, creating a good start to your child's school day.

Items to bring on the first day

- Their book bag (or rucksack) with school books returned from Year 1
- Year 1 reading journal
- Named water bottle (Please can water bottles be basic water bottles and not have extra features such as the scented pods)

Pick Up

The children should be picked up from their classroom doors at **3.15pm**. Year 2D parents should line up on the left hand side of the passage and 2S parents on the right hand side (the side nearer 2S's classroom). Your child's teacher will then call your child and say goodbye, exactly the same as in Year 1. This will also provide parents with the opportunity to speak to their child's class teacher.

Uniform

It is really important that every item of uniform and PE kit are **clearly named**. We will have high expectations in Year 2 for children looking after their belongings. This is difficult to do if their uniform is not clearly labelled. Thank you so much for supporting this.

On a **Wednesday and Thursday**, Year 2 have PE. Please can they come into school wearing their regular school uniform and bring their PE kit in a PE bag. They will then come home wearing their PE kit with their uniform in their PE bag.

The first week

The first few days back will focus on settling children so that they get to know their new teacher, understand the rules and systems in place and know where everything is. Our focus is on the children settling beautifully and feel confident in their new learning environment.

Systems, routines and expectations

We have written about key routines and systems below. Some of these may be slightly different to what you have been used to in Year 1.

Reading journals and book levels

Children are expected to have their reading books and journals with them every day. Please sign your child's reading journal **each night** when you read with them. The class teachers will be checking to see who is reading each day and awarding points to the tables with the most readers. Reading nightly makes a **significant difference** to your child's attainment. The reading journal is another good way of communicating any questions or queries with your child's class teacher.

In Year 2, the children will be given the opportunity each day to change their reading books if required.

We read with your child:

- Most weeks in guided reading in a group of 6
- Every half term one-to-one with your child
- During English lessons, we have groups and individuals reading frequently

Often, we will write a comment in your child's journal when we read with them so you can see their progression and to let you know how you can help support at home.


We will move your child up a colour level in the one-to-one session if we feel they are ready. Please be mindful that if you talk about moving colour bands a lot with your child they can feel disappointed if they do not move up one each time they read with us. Children can show improvement but not yet be ready for the next book band. We want to be able to celebrate their progression with them, whether or not they move up a colour level. Thank you for working with us on this and celebrating when your child moves a book band but not focussing on it.

Reading books

If your child is reading **at turquoise level** or above, they will bring home one fiction book and one non-fiction book. They can keep these until they have finished them and then change them.

If your child is reading colour bands red, yellow, green, blue or orange, they will bring home

- one highly decodable book each week to read and re-read for fluency.
- two supplementary books one fiction and one non-fiction
- some words that match their current attainment levels to use to practise blending



Home learning

Home learning will be set each **Friday** via Teams. If there are any additional sheets, we will print these out for you. Some tasks involve your child writing in the book and others do not. Home learning books will be collected in on a **Thursday**.

In the front of your child's home learning book, there is a chart that we would like the **parents to fill in each week** to let us know how their child got on with the task. This helps us with our planning so we appreciate your weekly feedback.

The home learning letter on Teams will also tell you with what the children have learnt about each week so it is an opportunity to discuss your child's learning with them. It also includes important messages, such as upcoming events and what we have been working on in class. You can also see what we've been up to by looking at Twitter.

Spelling

Each week your child will have 5 short, fun phonics lessons to help them learn a new rule. At the end of the week, they will get a list of **10 spellings** to learn for a test on the following Friday. Please practise these at home with your child. It is important that they consolidate their understanding of these rules at home. The national curriculum for spelling is quite challenging, so the more help here, the better. Spelling folders will also be collected in on a **Thursday**. Boxes for these will be in your child's classroom.

We will test the children on the national curriculum's Year 2 Common Exception Words in the first two weeks. This is a list of 62 words. We will then highlight the words that they are spelling correctly and provide you with a laminated sheet which shows you which words they should be working on and how you can support with this. If they already know these spellings and you'd like to do more spelling with your child, then there are additional spellings to learn in your child's reading journal.

Class reps

We have had wonderful class reps this year in Year 2 and so much parental support in general. If you would like to be the class rep of 2S or 2C next year, please email the class teacher.

Parent helpers

We value parental support with reading so that children can receive as much 1:1 support as possible. If you know you are available to help on Monday and/or Tuesdays pm please email your child's class teacher as soon as possible so we can get the DBS check started. There will also be a sign-up sheet available at our welcome and curriculum meeting in September.

Year 2 meeting

A 'Year 2 Curriculum meeting' will be held on **Tuesday 12th September at 7pm in the KS1 hall**. During this meeting we will talk to you about:

- How the children have settled
- The curriculum in Year 2
- New systems and routines such as home learning, spellings and handwriting
- How to help at home
- Expectations

Tuesday: reading journal, reading books, water bottle

Wednesday: named PE kit, reading journal, reading books, water bottle

Thursday: named PE kit, reading journal, reading books, water bottle, spelling folder and home learning book with work completed

Friday: reading journal, reading books, water bottle

Please continue to work on your child's targets set by your child's Year 1 teacher in their report. This will ensure that children are prepared for Year 2. Regularly reading with them is also incredibly helpful for them to maintain the progress they have made this year and to set them up for a positive start to Y2.
